C H A R I T Y C O M M I S S I O N .

In the matter of the Charity called Dr. Radcliffe's School Foundation, in the Ancient Parish of Steeple Aston, in the County of Oxfordshire, regulated by a Scheme made by the Minister of Education on the 3rd May 1956; and
In the matter of the Charities Act, 1960.

THE CHARITY COMMISSIONERS FOR ENGLAND AND WALES
HEREBY ORDER that the following Scheme be approved and
established:-

S C H E M E .

1. Administration of Charity. - The above-mentioned Charity and the property thereof shall be administered and managed subject to and in conformity with the provisions of the above-mentioned Scheme made on the 3rd May 1956 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Scheme) as varied or affected by the provisions of this Scheme.

2. Variation of Principal Scheme. - (I) Clause 15 of the Principal Scheme shall be henceforth as follows -

15.(1) The remaining net income of the Foundation (if any) shall be applied by the Trustees in either or both of the following ways:

- (a) In promoting the education (including social and physical training) of children and young persons under the age of 25 years who are either resident in the Parishes of Steeple Aston or Middle Aston or have attended the School of the Foundation for at least two years at any time and who are in need of financial assistance and in particular but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing:
- (i) in awarding to such children and young persons scholarships, exhibitions, bursaries, maintenance allowances or grants, tenable at any school, university, college of education, or other institution of further (including professional and technical) education approved for the purpose by the Trustees;
 - (ii) in providing financial assistance, outfits, clothing, tools, instruments or books to assist such children and young persons to pursue their education (including the study of music and other arts), to undertake travel in furtherance thereof, or to prepare for, or enter a profession, trade, occupation or service on leaving school, university, or other educational establishment.
- (b) In or towards providing such special benefits of any kind not normally provided by the local education authority at any school in the maintained sector attended by children and young persons resident as aforesaid as may from time to time be agreed between the Trustees and the Governors of the school concerned.

(2) If in any year the said net income is not required for application in manner aforesaid the Trustees may apply the same in either or both of the following ways:

- (a) for such charitable purposes for the general benefit of the inhabitants of the above-mentioned parishes as the Trustees think fit;
- (b) in making payments to the Trustees of the Charity known as Dr. Radcliffe's Almshouses, in the above-mentioned parishes, for application by the last-mentioned Trustees in augmentation of the income of that Charity.

(3) Within the limits prescribed by this Scheme the Trustees shall have full power to make rules for the award of scholarships, exhibitions, bursaries, maintenance allowances and other benefits, including rules as to the value and period of tenure of the awards and the qualifications, method of ascertainment and selection of candidates for benefit.

(4) The Trustees shall have regard to the desirability of consulting the said local education authority as to their general action under sub-clause (1) of this clause and, if occasion requires, as to the educational qualifications of candidates for benefit.

(II) In clause 19 of the Principal Scheme the words "and the appointment as Clerk or Secretary (to hold office at their pleasure) of one of themselves without salary or some other fit person at such salary, if any, as may be approved by the Minister of Education" are deleted.

(III) Immediately after clause 19 of the Principal Scheme there is inserted the following clause -

19A. The Trustees may appoint as clerk one of their number without remuneration who shall be dismissible at their pleasure or some other fit person at such reasonable salary and upon such reasonable terms as to notice within the limits permitted by law and otherwise as they think fit.

3. Questions under Scheme. - Any question as to the construction of this Scheme or as to the regularity or the validity of any acts done or about to be done under this Scheme shall be determined by the Charity Commissioners upon such application made to them for the purpose as they think sufficient.
