01.24.06 Petition

- The petition regarding development at the Old Quarry House had been received and previously acknowledged.

01.24.07 Reports from OCC/CDC

- Cllr Fatemian had submitted a report prior to the meeting and mentioned the handling by OCC of the tree which fell on Heyford Road during the recent gales. The owner of the tree had to clear the tree; she had engaged a contractor but was told by OCC to stop the work, the police told her she must get the road cleared, so she then had to employ another contractor. OCC didn't close the road and there was no signage. AF confirmed that the owner should be reimbursed by Highways.

- OCC budget will be finalised on 25th February

01.24.08 MCNP

The Reg 14 consultation started on 2nd Jan finishing 23 Feb with a steady stream of comments being received. The forum is made up of 12 PCs and Heyford Park has resigned from the forum and wishes to set up a separate Neighbourhood Plan of their own. This will be disruptive due to the legislative process and will cause further delays to the MCNP consultation on policies.

01.24.16 Correspondence

- This matter was raised up the agenda. An email had been received from a former resident regarding Blandford flies. Mat Watson has researched the fly problem and has spoken to researchers at Bournemouth University who have come up with a solution which has reduced by fly population by 98%. His report included:
- 1. Research and development of process and agent carried out by Bournemouth University. It's a non profit making organisation that does the work and is the only place in UK carrying out the work.
- 2. Has reduced population of Blandford fly by 98% in affected areas from Stour River
- 3. Was funded by County Council due to incidents of bites and escalating problem actually affecting house prices.
- 4. Cherwell River known to be a Blandford fly breeding ground.
- 5. He's been contacted by various doctors in Oxfordshire to help but as yet no joined up or organisation pushing a joined up action plan.
- 6. Cost for county wide treatment would be... £20k initial survey, £30k first year treatment and testing and the £15k a year after. This is based on figures from Dorset.

Treatment would need to commence March/April.

ML has contacted members of MCNP to see if other areas have a similar problem to SA and if any other PCs would be interested in joining forces.

Cllr Fatemian joined the discussion and reported that Deddington is particularly badly affected by the flies. He will make enquiries and see if any funding may be available from OCC. **MW will forward him details of his contact in Bournemouth.**

ML will write an open letter to local GPs to find out the extent of the problem.

MW to speak to his contact regarding using Cherwell as a testing area and costs involved

23/03298/TCA	Westfield Fenway Steeple Aston OX25 4SS	T1 x Multi stemmed Cotoneaster- Between Fenway and Westfield. It has outgrown its space and now extends into the road inconveniencing traffic, blocks one of our gates, one stem is pushing against the boundary wall and it is also now nearly touching our house wall. See sketch and photo. The tree is approx 18 feet high. We anticipate that to produce a balanced end result it will be necessary to reduce the overall height to around 9 feet and the spread accordingly to stop the tree projecting into the road and across the gate.
